Funding

Currently, Janice Thies has a proposal, titled “Environmentally Sound Rice Production,” in process with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. The Cornell portion of the \$4,000,000 proposal is \$1,200,000). The application process is expected to be long, but funding is predicted to be highly likely.

In 2008, Durba Ghosh was awarded an American Institute of Indian Studies Senior Research Fellowship for \$22,000, and an American Philosophical Society sabbatic fellowship for \$38,000. These grants support her 08-09 research project in India: “Revolutionaries and Freedom Fighters: nationalism in Bengal in the twentieth century.”
