2017-18 CPC Grant Development Program: Call for Proposals

CPC invites applications to the 2017-18 CPC Grant Development Program (GDP). The GDP supports the development and submission of grant proposals to population-related external funding agencies under the guidance and support of CPC affiliates and grant support staff.

Grant Development Fellows (GDFs) selected for the 2017-18 program will be assigned a senior CPC faculty mentor who will provide them with guidance, advice, and feedback on the development of a grant proposal and help them to build a network of scholars with expertise in the subject area of the proposal. GDFs will meet regularly from May 2017 through the Fall of 2018. Opportunities to share ideas in small groups of similarly situated faculty, meetings with faculty and staff who have experience developing proposals for population-related research, additional assistance as needed, and a clear schedule and set of deadlines will lead to the development of outstanding proposals. In addition to attending training and mentorship meetings, GDFs commit to producing (1) a draft proposal for external funding by December 1, 2017; (2) a final proposal following internal review by January 15, 2018; and (3) a competitive grant submission no later than June 2018.

This call is open to all CPC faculty affiliates. Up to three applications will be selected based on a competitive review. Highest priority will be given to:

- Faculty at the assistant and associate levels
- New investigators, i.e., those without an established record of large external grants
- Cross-college collaborations
- Proposals targeted to the National Institutes of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD) Social Sciences and Population Studies panels

Successful applications will be awarded \$15,000 in project-related research support (deposited into unrestricted faculty research accounts) and access to funds for consultative support (i.e., proposal pre-review).

Applications should be submitted in PDF to population@cornell.edu. The deadline for submissions is March 31, 2017. Please include: a title; description of research aims, approach, significance, planned activities, and expected outputs (not to exceed 1000 words); C.V. or 5-page biosketch.

Results of the review will be available by April 15th. Please let us know if you have any questions.
